Advocacy for Family Medicine

The Faculty in our Department care about the Future of Family Medicine in Arizona and worry about the increasing primary care shortage, the rate of physician burnout, the decline in students choosing primary care, and the fate of our health systems. We are taking some steps to address this.

Department Updates

Research

The department is steadily increasing research faculty with protected research time. We have submitted a large number of grant applications in the last year. We are currently completing an inventory of faculty research interest-we want to identify areas of passion and support our faculty with coordinated support and resources. We will create affinity groups, connecting researchers with similar interests to develop projects and grant applications (with department support). We are sending out a survey of research interests and would like faculty to complete it.

Graduate Medical Education

Banner University Phoenix Family Medicine Residency class starts in June.

Payson Family Medicine Residency starts their second class of two residents this Summer and their clinic expansion opens in June.

Banner Desert Residency first class of six residents start this Summer. They have several graduates of the BUMCP FM residency joining their faculty.

These expansions have doubled the COM-P Banner FM residents (from 8 to 16).



Our actions this year include:

- + Updated department strategy that specifically includes Arizona Future of Family Medicine initiatives
- Helped obtain \$7 million in grants to support primary care workforce strategies (and we are applying for more)
- Collaboration across the sate with Academic Primary Care leaders, a residency learning network, and a primary care research network
- * A Summit with stakeholders to address Primary Care Physician shortage (we had 88 leaders in attendance!) A report on the summit will be published online and a workgroup will continue.
- Gathering a team to compile and track statewide data on the continuum of primary care physician workforce (and make it visible and accessible)
- Creating primary care admissions, innovating around longitudinal and accelerated curriculum, developing community training partnerships and primary care scholarships
- Expanding primary care-focused student pathways programs, increasing opportunities for students to learn about Family Medicine
